Australian universities are at risk of foreign interference because they lead policy, research and scientific development.



The Australian Government and Universities formed the University Foreign Interference Taskforce (UFIT) in 2019 to manage the risk of foreign interference in tertiary education.



If Australian research or sensitive data is compromised, students and staff risk losing intellectual property and commercial advantage. The risks extend beyond individual academic reputation, to the university, the economy and national security.
